
























The 17 Sustainable **Development Goals**






























Governance









Governance

Marmara University, which has a deep-rooted history of 141 years, acts with the vision of contributing to the development and progress of science and adding value to society with the qualified people it graduates. Marmara University, which is a state university, has a rightful and privileged reputation with its achievements in the fields of culture-art, health and sports, as well as education and scientific research. Our university, where education is effectively provided in four different foreign languages other than Turkish, is also a pioneer and unique with this feature.

There are 21 faculties, 1 college, 4 vocational colleges and 13 institutes within Marmara University, and it provides education with 3 Education Centers and 39 Research and Application Centers. In addition, the Department of Atatürk's Principles and History of Revolution and the Department of Turkish Language, which are affiliated to the Rectorate, ensure that compulsory common courses are given. 2,986 academic personnel and 1,099 administrative personnel are assigned in the execution of our university's activities.



Governance Structure



The governance structure of Marmara University is organized to ensure that institutional decision-making and implementation processes are carried out with transparency, participation, and efficiency. The university's highest governing bodies consist of the Rectorate, the University Senate, and the University Executive Board. These structures form the foundation of the academic and administrative governance system and are supported by faculty boards, department councils, and various academic and administrative commissions across the institution.

The University Senate is the highest academic body and is chaired by the Rector. It is composed of vice-rectors, faculty deans, one elected academic member from each faculty, and the directors of institutes and schools affiliated with the university. The Senate is responsible for shaping academic policies, approving academic calendars and curricula, and drafting university-wide regulations. It ensures consistency in academic standards and coordination across faculties.

The University Executive Board is chaired by the Rector and includes the deans and three professors elected by the Senate for a four-year term. This board is responsible for administrative planning and implementation, monitoring the execution of Senate decisions, and ensuring alignment with national higher education policies. It also evaluates faculty and institutional proposals related to investment programs and budget planning.

The Rector is appointed by the Presidency of the Republic of Türkiye in accordance with national legislation and serves as the head of the university's executive branch, officially representing the institution. Vice-rectors assist the Rector in overseeing specific domains such as research, student affairs, institutional development, and administrative operations.

All faculties and departments operate under similar governance structures, contributing to institutional coherence, governance continuity, and operational effectiveness across the university.







Good Governance and Institutional Accountability

Marmara University prioritizes transparency, accountability, participation, and the rule of law in its academic and administrative operations by adopting the principles of good governance. Its institutional structure, grounded in ethical values, supports a fair, inclusive, and effective management approach. By regularly sharing strategic plans, performance reports, and internal audit results with the public, the university institutionalizes accountability and strengthens a culture of transparent governance. Faculty members, administrative staff, and students actively participate in decision-making processes through mechanisms such as the senate, faculty boards, and representative bodies, making democratic participation a fundamental component of university governance.

Through structures such as the Ethics Committee, Internal Audit Unit, and the Directive on Combating Sexual Harassment and Assault, the university ensures a working environment aligned with ethical principles and legal standards. Units such as the Gender Equality Commission, the Office for Students with Disabilities, and the Center for Women's Studies in Economic and Social Areas (ESKAR) contribute to a governance approach that promotes inclusivity and equal representation. The university adopts a data-driven management approach in its decision-making processes and develops effective and transparent practices based on performance indicators and academic data.



Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions





Equity in Participation and Representation

Marmara University adopts a governance model that encourages the active participation of students and staff in decision-making processes. Through student clubs, student representation in the senate, faculty boards, and various academic and administrative committees, students and personnel are directly involved in shaping institutional decisions.

Inclusive governance is further supported by specialized units aimed at increasing the representation of disadvantaged groups (such as persons with disabilities, women, and minorities), including the Disabled Student Unit, ESKAR (Women's Studies Research and Application Center), and the Gender Equality Commission. A pluralistic and fair representation system, where all individuals have equal voice and participation rights, is a cornerstone of the university's institutional structure.

Ethical and Transparent Governance

Marmara University adopts a governance model based on ethical values to ensure that all academic and administrative processes are conducted in an open and auditable manner. Merit-based principles guide academic promotions, appointments, and performance evaluations, which are carried out with transparent and measurable criteria. Strategic plans, performance reports, internal control system information, and budget tables are publicly shared via the university's official website, transforming accountability into a core institutional culture.

Additionally, institutional practices are carried out in accordance with ethical standards through the internal audit unit, ethics committee, and quality assurance systems. This approach ensures the protection of internal stakeholders' rights while maintaining a transparent management style towards external stakeholders.

Human Rights and Peace Education

Marmara University aims to educate students not only with professional knowledge but also as peaceful, democratic, and human rights-conscious individuals. To this end, the curriculum includes courses on ethics, human rights, gender equality, democracy, and the rule of law. Particularly in the Faculty of Law and other departments, courses such as Human Rights Law, Society and Ethics, and Gender and Law help raise awareness on these critical issues.

Furthermore, the academic environment is enriched with human rights-oriented events such as the Workshop on the Social Participation and Employment of Women with Disabilities, Gender Equality Training Programs, and Seminars on Combating Violence Against Women, all of which contribute to a socially responsible and rights-based institutional culture.



Student Union


Marmara University fully supports student rights. In this context, a student council has been established. The council aims to impartially evaluate opinions, requests, and suggestions in all areas concerning students—especially education—to communicate them to administrative bodies, to follow up on proposed solutions, and to permanently enhance the quality of education and campus life through projects and initiatives that increase youth participation. It also strives to make students an active part of realizing the university's vision of becoming a developing and successful academic and social institution.

Student representatives are elected through democratic elections. These representatives come together to form the Faculty Student Representative Boards and the Marmara University Student Council General Assembly. The purpose of the faculty-level units is to identify and examine problems within the university, conduct research and assessments related to education, research, and student services, and submit their findings to the Student Council Executive Board. The Executive Board serves as the main executive body and carries out all executive duties during the election term.

Justice for Foreign Students

Marmara University offers education in five different languages: Turkish, English, German, French, and Arabic, aiming to create a multilingual and multicultural academic environment. In this context, the university continues to increase its international student admissions, welcoming students from various parts of the world. This approach reflects the university's commitment not only to academic excellence but also to promoting peace, justice, and inclusivity on a societal level.

By bringing together diverse cultures, the university seeks to foster an educational atmosphere based on tolerance, understanding, and mutual respect. To support this goal, Marmara University provides scholarship opportunities, academic guidance services, and social activities that ease cultural integration for international students. Through its commitment to providing an equal, fair, and supportive learning environment free from discrimination, the university encourages individual development and contributes to the building of peaceful and inclusive societies.







Peace and Justice

Marmara University aims to create a safe and inclusive campus environment where all students, academic, and administrative staff are supported based on the principles of justice, equality, and fairness. The university is committed to ensuring that academic and administrative decision-making processes are conducted impartially, transparently, and in accordance with due process. Establishing a campus climate in which every individual has equal rights is one of the fundamental principles of its governance processes.

In this context, various structures and mechanisms have been established within the university to promote justice. The Directive on Combating Sexual Harassment and Assault provides a framework for handling cases with a transparent, sensitive, and preventive approach. The Ethics Committee ensures adherence to ethical standards by addressing violations related to academic integrity, discrimination, and unethical behavior. The Internal Audit Unit monitors the university's institutional functioning for compliance with legal and ethical principles.

To protect student rights and strengthen participatory governance, students actively take part in university decision-making through the Student Council and faculty-level representatives, elected through democratic processes. These representation mechanisms allow students to directly communicate their views, suggestions, and complaints to the relevant bodies, thereby reinforcing principles of participation and institutional justice.

Moreover, courses on human rights, ethics, and constitutional law, along with various seminars, workshops, and panels, help raise legal awareness and foster justice-based thinking among individuals across the university. All these practices contribute to building an inclusive, just, and safe academic environment at Marmara University.



Jean Monnet Centers of Excellence

Marmara University European Union Institute is one of the distinguished Jean Monnet Centers of Excellence across Europe, dedicated to promoting "European integration" within universities and higher education institutions. Awarded the prestigious Center of **Excellence status by the European Commission in 2005, the Institute** continues to actively contribute to this mission.

The Institute aims to foster education and research on European integration through academic programs, expert workshops, and the publication of various scholarly works. Additionally, it seeks to enhance awareness and understanding of current developments in Europe within Turkey, serving as a vital bridge between Turkish academia and European Union studies.





Peace, Justice, and Historical Awareness Initiatives



Symposium on the 50th Anniversary of the Cyprus Peace Operation

On December 13, 2024, Marmara University hosted the "50th Anniversary of the Cyprus Peace Operation" symposium at the Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall, with online participation from the President of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus, Ersin Tatar. Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt and President Tatar highlighted the historical significance of the Cyprus Peace Operation, Turkey's role in ensuring the security and rights of the Turkish Cypriot community, and the operation's lasting impact on regional stability. The symposium included three sessions chaired by Prof. Dr. Ali Satan, Doç. Dr. Abdulkadir Akıl, and Prof. Dr. Ulvi Keser, featuring presentations from academics on the historical, political, and social aspects of the Cyprus issue.

Free Palestine March

On May 7, 2024, Marmara University students organized the "Free Palestine March" at the Göztepe Campus to condemn the genocide in Palestine and express solidarity with the Palestinian resistance.

The march, which began at the open-air amphitheater and concluded at the main entrance gate with a student declaration of support, was attended by Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt, vice rectors, the secretary general, senate members, and numerous academics.



February 28: Postmodern Coup Program

On February 29, 2024, Marmara University hosted the event "February 28: Postmodern Coup" at the Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall, organized in collaboration with the Turkish Youth Foundation (TÜGVA) Istanbul Universities Coordination and the New Generation Student Club. Held on the anniversary of the February 28 coup, the program featured guest speaker Minister of Justice Yılmaz Tunç and was moderated by TÜGVA President İbrahim Beşinci, with high participation from the university's leadership, academics, and students.

Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt emphasized the historical and democratic lessons of the February 28 process, calling it a unique "postmodern" coup that targeted both the government and fundamental freedoms of society. Following his speech, the documentary "Witness" was screened, portraying testimonies from that period. Minister Tunç addressed the deep wounds caused by the coup, its economic and social costs, and stressed the importance of ensuring such undemocratic interventions never occur again through constitutional reforms and youth awareness.

Support for Palestinian Resistance by Marmara University Students

On May 3, 2024, Marmara University students gathered to raise awareness about the genocide in Palestine and express their support for the Palestinian resistance. Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt met with the students, commending their moral stance and noting that Türkiye has been one of the strongest supporters of the Palestinian cause in the international arena.







National Commemoration and Civic Awareness Events



Marmara University Commemorates Atatürk on November 10

On November 10, 2024, Marmara University held a ceremony at the Atatürk Monument in Göztepe Campus to mark the 86th anniversary of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk's passing.

The event began with a wreath-laying by Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt and a moment of silence at 09:05, followed by the national anthem performed under the direction of Prof. Dr. Mustafa Uslu. Prof. Dr. Bülent Bakar delivered a speech on "November 10, Atatürk, and Leadership," highlighting Atatürk's enduring legacy as a national and global leader.



15 July Democracy and National Unity Day Program at Marmara University

On July 16, 2024, Marmara University commemorated 15 July with a program at Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall. Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt highlighted the nation's commitment to democracy and unity.

The event included a lecture by Asst. Prof. Dr. Furkan Kaya on Turkey's historical coup attempts, followed by a screening of the 15 July documentary and a concert by the university music ensemble under Prof. Dr. Mustafa Uslu.



Marmara University Celebrates the 101st Anniversary of the Republic

On October 28, 2024, Marmara University commemorated the 101st anniversary of the Republic at Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall. Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt emphasized the significance of the Republic, honoring Mustafa Kemal Atatürk and the nation's heroes, and underlined the role of youth in safeguarding and advancing the Republic. The program included the screening of the special documentary "Cumhuriyet'in Kuruluş Hikayesini Kazım Özalp Anlatıyor: İstanbul Valiliği 29 Ekim Özel Filmi" followed by a conference by Prof. Dr. Sevtap Demirci from Boğaziçi University, detailing the historical context, struggles, and achievements in the founding of the Republic.



Decent Work and Inclusive Employment Policies



Employment Policies and Equal Opportunity

Marmara University has adopted policies to provide a discrimination-free, fair, and inclusive working environment for all its employees. Established in 2017, the Center for Women's Studies in Economic and Social Fields (ESKAR) leads efforts to raise awareness on gender equality, strengthen women's leadership and entrepreneurship skills, and promote these values within the university.

The university pays all academic and administrative staff at least the living wage determined by the Civil Servants Law of 1965. Additionally, it provides supplementary benefits and services such as meals, transportation, and healthcare to enhance the social welfare of its personnel.

Policies to increase the ratio of female employees, projects supporting female graduates' participation in the workforce, and career guidance services targeting young graduates strengthen social inclusiveness at Marmara University.




Education and Research











Sustainable Education

Distance Learning

Marmara University has been providing distance education services since 2011. With approximately 10,000 students registered in 4 associate degrees, 2 master's degrees, and 3 common main course programs, it is the leading position in Turkey in this regard and continues to grow every passing year. By incorporating developments over time, today we have been provided with unlimited course opportunities, and we have reached the software and hardware power to conduct live lessons with 1000 people at the same time. With the academic LMS software, our faculty members provide our students with more functional and interactive sharing than what is offered in the classical classroom.



Sustainable Digital Education

In line with sustainable development goals, the campus has chosen to reduce paper use, time and costs, and has transitioned to sustainable digital transformation with an environmentally friendly approach. In addition, in order to increase the quality of education and training, a transition to digital smart systems has been made in the classrooms. In this context, "Digital Transformation and Data Management Coordination" was launched.

The conference was attended by the President of the Council of Higher Education (CoHE) Prof. Dr. Erol Özvar, YÖKAK President Prof. Dr. Ümit Kocabıçak, university rectors, deans and many academics.







Library Services

Marmara University's central library welcomes external visitors interested in academic research and study. While borrowing privileges are typically reserved for current students and staff, external users may obtain a visitor's card that grants access to on-site resources and selected digital collections. This initiative contributes to the university's mission of public engagement and knowledge sharing with the wider community.

Online and Lifelong Learning Programs

Marmara University periodically hosts public lectures, seminars, and conferences that are open to non-students. These events often cover topics of general interest or current research and are sometimes streamed online or made available for later viewing. By doing so, the university fosters community engagement, encourages dialogue on important issues, and ensures that its educational mission reaches a wider and more diverse audience.

Open Access Courses and Digital Content

Marmara University leverages its official YouTube channel as a dynamic tool for making educational content publicly available. The channel hosts recordings of university lectures, academic events, and conferences, and also features outreach videos prepared by faculty members. Additionally, videos prepared by the Disabled Student Unit Coordinatorship are published to raise awareness and share knowledge. These efforts reflect the university's dedication to creating educational value for society at large.

Public Events and Seminars

The university also offers vocational training opportunities that are open to individuals who are not enrolled as students. These practical and career-oriented programs aim to equip participants with specific skills and qualifications that are applicable in the job market. Such offerings demonstrate the university's role in contributing to workforce development and lifelong learning on a national level.

Vocational Training Programs

"International Football and Science Congress Launched at Marmara University"

The International Football and Science Congress, organized by Marmara University's Faculty of Sport Sciences, began on May 28, 2024, at the National Teams Training Center in Riva. Opening the event with a concert by the Turkish Music Ensemble, the program welcomed prominent participants including TFF Honorary President Şenes Erzik, TFF Vice President Mustafa Eröğüt, Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt, and top coaches and academics.

Focusing on "Individual Technical and Tactical Training Approaches," the congress addressed sports science, performance-preserving training models, and the application of scientific methods in football. Speakers emphasized the importance of integrating scientific research into sports for athlete development, injury prevention, and performance enhancement. The congress also highlighted Turkey's upcoming major international sports events, including the 2032 European Football Championship, and the crucial role universities play in supporting sports science and national athletic excellence.

Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt Attends Interuniversity Board (ÜAK) Executive Meeting

Marmara University Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt participated in the Interuniversity Board (ÜAK) Executive Meeting hosted by Trakya University. Chaired by ÜAK President Prof. Dr. Veysel Eren, the meeting covered topics including associate professorship application results, reports from the associate professorship, ethics, and equivalence commissions, and other agenda items requested for review by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK). As a key academic coordination body, ÜAK ensures collaboration among universities, addresses faculty needs, and prepares laws and regulations affecting higher education. Rector Kurt contributed to the meeting with his insights and recommendations.

Marmara University Represented at NAFSA 2024

Marmara University participated in the NAFSA 2024 Conference, held from May 28-31 in New Orleans, USA, one of the world's largest international higher education conferences. The event gathered over 3,000 academics and professionals from more than 100 countries, providing workshops, seminars, and networking opportunities in international education.

Represented by General Secretary Assoc. Prof. Dr. Murat Arısal, Director of the International Relations and Academic Cooperation Office Prof. Dr. Nuri Tinaz, and their team, Marmara University hosted a stand and conducted bilateral meetings with over 100 institutions. The discussions focused on establishing and expanding academic partnerships, supporting newly opened departments, enhancing international visibility, promoting research university objectives, and increasing cultural diversity in student and academic exchanges.

'TÖDEB Fintech Apprentice Program' Graduates Its First Cohort

The TÖDEB Fintech Apprentice Program, a collaboration between the Turkish Payment and Electronic Money Institutions Association (TÖDEB) and Marmara University, held its 2023-2024 Certificate Ceremony on July 3 at the Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ahmet Talat İnan emphasized the program's success in its first year, highlighting the master-apprentice model and the combination of academic knowledge with practical industry experience. Speakers, including Ozan Çağrı Gazitürk and TÖDEB Chairman Ufuk Bilgetekin, underlined the program's role in fostering public-private collaboration, continuous learning, and professional growth. The ceremony concluded with certificate presentations and a panel featuring graduates and their mentors sharing their experiences.





Educational and Cultural Workshops and Symposiums

Turkish Easy Language Project Workshop

On December 17, 2024, Marmara University hosted a workshop as part of TÜBİTAK's "Institutional Framework for Turkish Easy Language" project. The workshop focused on developing methods to make language more inclusive and communication more understandable for all. Discussions emphasized reducing linguistic barriers for diverse groups, including individuals with hearing impairments, learning difficulties, the elderly, and non-native Turkish speakers. Rector Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kurt highlighted the importance of easy language in promoting social participation and accessibility. During the sessions, TÜBİTAK Project Manager Assoc. Prof. Dr. Sine Demirkıvıran presented "Foundations of Easy Language," Dr. Fayıka Göktepe discussed "Turkish Easy Language as Intra-Language Translation," and officials from the Ministry of National Education and Ministry of Family and Social Services shared initiatives supporting social engagement and accessibility. The event underscored the significance of scientifically grounded easy language applications in improving societal inclusion and communication.

History Teachers Workshop

On June 25–26, 2024, Marmara University's Atatürk Faculty of Education, in collaboration with the Istanbul Provincial Directorate of National Education and Istanbul Teacher Academies, hosted the History Teachers Workshop at the Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall.

The two-day event began with an opening speech by Dean Prof. Dr. Seyfi Kenan, who highlighted history as the greatest teacher of life and emphasized that ideology and history should remain separate. Deputy Minister of National Education Dr. Ömer Faruk Yelkenci noted that the workshop aligned with the Turkey Century Maarif Model, providing a valuable platform for interdisciplinary discussion and integrating national, moral, and universal values.

2nd International Symposium on Social Sciences and Turkish **Culture (SOBİTÜRK)**

Marmara University's Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences organized the 2nd International Symposium on Social Sciences and Turkish Culture from October 23-25, 2024, at the Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall and Dolmabahçe Palace.

The symposium, themed "Disasters", focused on the social, psychological, demographic, and cultural impacts of disasters, including effects on wildlife, cultural heritage, literature, and arts, and strategies for disaster preparedness and post-disaster solutions.

Opening remarks were delivered by Prof. Dr. Sebahat Deniz (Dean) and Prof. Dr. Erhan Afyoncu (Rector of the National Defense University). Key presentations included Prof. Dr. Mustafa Kemal Tunçer on the predictability of earthquakes. Over three days, sessions explored disasters from historical, sociological, psychological, economic, and administrative perspectives.

16th Traditional Global Communication Association Conference Launched at Marmara University

Community Engagement and Social Responsibility Initiatives









"Future with the Touch of Healthcare Students" Social **Responsibility Project**

On April 23, National Sovereignty and Children's Day, students from Marmara University's Medical Imaging Techniques Program organized a volunteer project to celebrate the day. Under the guidance of Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nuran Akyurt, the "Future with the Touch of Healthcare Students" project was implemented simultaneously across five regions of Turkey. Presentations included "From Sand to Glass -Silk Road from Ceramics" by Prof. Dr. Dilshat Tulyaganov (Turin Polytechnic University, Uzbekistan) and "Alginates from Seaweed: Smart Drug Delivery Devices" by Dr. Lissette Agüero Luztonó (BIOMAT, University of Havana, Cuba). The event concluded with a laboratory visit and discussions for joint scientific projects.

My Student's Patient Rights Panel

Organized by Marmara University's Disabled Student Unit Coordination on May 16, 2024, the panel aimed to raise awareness among teacher candidates about patient rights and issues affecting disadvantaged groups. Prof. Dr. Gürkan Sert, Chair of the Department of Medical Ethics at Marmara University Faculty of Medicine, highlighted the importance of patient rights through legal examples. The panel was attended by a large number of teacher candidates.

Collaboration Protocol for the 2024 Turkey Demographic and Health Survey

On 31 May 2024, Marmara University signed a cooperation protocol with the Presidency of Strategy and Budget, TÜBİTAK, and Hacettepe University for the 2024 Turkey Demographic and Health Survey. Conducted for the first time in five years, the survey will collect data from approximately 20,000 households, providing vital demographic, social, and maternal-child health indicators. The findings will inform evidence-based policies in areas such as fertility, healthy and active ageing, early childhood development, and migration management. Marmara University contributes through its Population and Social Policies Research and Application Centre, supporting the development of strategies that address demographic challenges and promote sustainable development.

Collaboration with the Turkish Football Federation Referee Academy

Marmara University signed a cooperation protocol with the Turkish Football Federation (TFF) Referee Academy, along with four other universities, during a ceremony held at the Hasan Doğan National Teams Camp and Training Facilities. The partnership aims to contribute to the development of Turkish football through joint training and development programs for referees. The initiative reflects Marmara University's commitment to advancing sports education and fostering professional excellence in sports officiating.

Sustainability Cooperation Protocol with the Development and Investment Bank of Turkey

Marmara University signed a Sustainability Cooperation Protocol with the Development and Investment Bank of Turkey (TKYB) on 17 May 2024 at the Rectorate Building. The protocol aims to foster collaboration on sustainability research topics, creating opportunities for joint projects, academic development, and sectoral engagement. This partnership strengthens the connection between academia and the finance sector, supporting knowledge exchange and capacity building in sustainability-focused initiatives.

Collaboration Protocol with the Ministry of Labour and Social Security and İŞKUR

On 24 May 2024, Marmara University signed a vocational training cooperation protocol with the Ministry of Labour and Social Security and the Turkish Employment Agency (İŞKUR) at the Rectorate. The protocol aims to organize vocational training courses within the scope of İŞKUR's workforce services, addressing the need for qualified labor in targeted sectors and workplaces. This collaboration strengthens the link between education and employment, supporting skill development and workforce participation.





Collaborations

Collaboration Protocol with the Turkish Automobile Sports Federation (TOSFED)

On 2 August 2024, Marmara University's Faculty of Health Sciences, Department of Nutrition and Dietetics, signed a cooperation protocol with the Turkish Automobile Sports Federation (TOSFED) to conduct research on the "Relationship Between Hydration and Performance in Motor Sports." Led by Assoc. Prof. Ayşe Hümeyra İslamoğlu, the project investigates athletes' hydration status and its link to race performance through anthropometric measurements, surveys, and performance analyses. Initially piloted at the first stage of the AVIS Turkey Track Championship, the project will continue throughout the season, with the aim of expanding its findings to other sports disciplines in the future.

Collaboration Protocol for the "Muhtarlar Academy"

On 29 July 2024, Marmara University, Istanbul University, and the Governorship of Istanbul signed a cooperation protocol to establish the "Muhtarlar (Village and Neighborhood Heads) Academy." The program aims to provide training to 961 muhtars in Istanbul, equipping them with up-to-date knowledge on public services, legal frameworks, communication skills, and community problem-solving. Trainings will be delivered by academic staff—Marmara University on the Anatolian side and Istanbul University on the European side—covering topics from social and legal issues to health and digital transformation. Upon completion, participants will receive certificates, enhancing their capacity to serve their communities effectively.

Collaboration Protocol with the International Organization of Turkic Culture (TÜRKSOY)

On 19 December 2024, Marmara University and the International Organization of Turkic Culture (TÜRKSOY) signed a cooperation protocol aimed at strengthening sustainable partnerships in education, culture, arts, and research. The agreement, based on principles of equality and mutual benefit, fosters joint initiatives and reciprocal understanding between both institutions and their affiliated units. The signing ceremony took place at Marmara University Rectorate, attended by senior representatives including the Director of the Institute of Turkic Studies.













Research and Academic Contributions



European Union Projects















LoLiPoP-IoT: Long-Life Power Platforms for IoT

This project aims to develop innovative long-life power platforms to enhance wireless sensor networks in IoT applications. It includes developing algorithms for asset tracking and predictive maintenance. Applications target Industry 4.0, smart mobility, and energy-efficient buildings. Marmara University will focus on AI and machine learning for predictive maintenance, low-power IoT communication, and image processing for quality control, conducting tests and integration in real industrial environments.

BRIGHTER: Breakthrough in micro-bolometer imaging

Infrared imaging is expanding rapidly with innovative solutions. Micro-bolometer sensors—compact, lightweight, low-power, reliable, and affordable—will be enhanced to narrow the performance gap with cooled sensors.

Marmara University will contribute expertise in Artificial Intelligence, Communication, Image Processing, and Edge Computing to the "Intelligent Intersection/VRU Safety" use case. Additionally, it will support Arcelik's use case on "Electronic Card Reliability and Fault Detection." This project aims to boost Europe's market share in the infrared imaging sector.



DECICE (Device-Edge-Cloud Intelligent Collaboration Framework)

This project develops an open, portable cloud management framework to optimize performance and energy efficiency in heterogeneous systems combining cloud and edge computing. By using holistic monitoring and Al-based scheduling, DECICE maps jobs and data to the most suitable resources, adapts to system changes, and integrates with Kubernetes. It is validated through real-world use cases in smart cities, industrial automation, and data analytics.

MARS: Understanding Migration Towards Non-Western Destinations

Funded by MSCA, the MARS project addresses a gap in migration studies by focusing on non-Western migration destinations, which accounted for 12 of the top 20 international migrant destinations in 2020. Through research and staff exchanges, the project aims to improve understanding of migration governance at global, regional, and national levels. It seeks to generate empirical data, contribute to theoretical debates, develop innovative methods, and translate findings into policy recommendations to enhance migration governance practices.

CARSI Project Explores EU's Unique Approach to **Caucasus and Central Asian Regions**

Supported by Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions, the CARSI project investigates the EU's distinct strategy in engaging with the resource-rich and strategically located Caucasus and Central Asian regions. Unlike other global powers such as China and India, the EU focuses not only on technical innovation and market access but also on social and human development. The project fosters collaboration between institutions across two continents to train researchers and generate new empirical insights on these regions.

Active Citizenship in the New Homeland (Act-New **Home) Erasmus+ Project**

This project develops an e-learning module to educate asylum seekers and refugees about their rights and duties. It also enhances educators' skills in universities, public institutions, and NGOs to provide effective active citizenship training. Funded by the European Commission, it involves partners from Turkey and several EU countries.

Multilevel Orders of Corruption in Central Asia

Supported by the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions programme, MOCCA aims to enhance global and national anti-corruption efforts. The project examines multilevel corruption structures in five post-Soviet Central Asian countries (Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan), providing insights to inform EU political and economic engagement in the region.

Tackling informal employment in Asia: building post-COV19 solutions to precariousness through case-study based evidence on Bhutan, Laos, Maldives, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam

Supported by the EU, the LABOUR project focuses on tackling informal and precarious employment in Southeast Asia, a region where the issue is particularly severe. With over 60% of the world's workforce engaged in the informal economy, the project aims to train regional specialists, enhance research capacity, and develop effective strategies to address labour vulnerability and improve working conditions.



Eu's Sustainability in Global Governance

The Jean Monnet Center of Excellence, named "EU's Sustainability in Global Governance", supported by the European Commission between 2022 and 2025 under the Erasmus+ Program, basically aims to examine and evaluate the contribution of the EU's sustainability to global governance in a holistic manner on a theoretical and empirical level.

Regenerated Cotton for Electronic Textiles (RETEX)

Funded by Horizon Europe (MSCA SE-2021), RETEX aims to develop sustainable electronic textile materials by replacing conventional textiles with regenerated fibers from cotton fabrics. The project unites international experts in materials science, polymers, chemistry, environmental studies, and design to advance eco-friendly innovations. Through crosssector collaboration, RETEX will train the next generation of researchers, promote knowledge exchange, and explore commercial applications for sustainable textiles.

Smart Textiles made from Agriculture and Natural **Waste Materials**

Supported by the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions programme, SMARTWASTE focuses on developing sustainable smart textiles using agricultural and natural waste materials, such as cellulose fibers from tomato stems and nonwovens from poplar seed fibers. The project brings together experts across materials science, chemistry, environmental studies, and design to create eco-friendly, cost-effective textile alternatives, fostering an international, cross-sector research network.

Central Asian Law Project

Funded by the EU, this project examines the links between legal cultures, business ethics, and governance in Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan. It seeks to address challenges such as legal uncertainty and informality faced by EU businesses in the region, and to provide insights for improving the business climate, rule of law, and governance.

TÜBİTAK TEYDEB 1505 University-Industry Collaboration Project Approved for NBUAM

The Nanotechnology and Biomaterials Application and Research Center (NBUAM) at Marmara University received TÜBİTAK TEYDEB 1505 funding for a university-industry collaboration project with Deriworks. The project aims to develop an artificial environment capable of sustaining human hair follicles. This project represents the highest budget award received by the university under the TÜBİTAK TEYDEB 1505 calls, marking a significant advancement in applied biomaterials research.

TÜSEB Project Success from the Faculty of Pharmacy

Research Assistant Dr. Damla Damar Çelik from Marmara University's Faculty of Pharmacy, along with Dr. Erkan Rayaman from the Department of Pharmaceutical Microbiology, received support from TÜSEB for their project titled "Cloning, Purification of MazG, ORF1, and ORF2 Proteins of Pseudomonas 56 Phage and Investigation of Their Antibacterial and Antibiofilm Activities Against Multidrug-Resistant P. Aeruginosa Isolates." This research contributes to combating antibiotic resistance and advancing healthcare innovation.

Hydrogen Energy Systems Research Laboratory Project Approved

The project titled "Establishment of a Hydrogen Energy Systems Research Laboratory", led by faculty members from the Department of Chemical Engineering at Marmara University's Faculty of Engineering, has been included in Türkiye's 2024 investment program by the Presidency of Strategy and Budget. The laboratory will focus on R&D and product development for green hydrogen production, contributing to advancements in sustainable energy technologies.

TÜBİTAK 1001 Project Success in Environmental Engineering

Prof. Dr. Bilge Alpaslan Kocamemi from Marmara University's Department of Environmental Engineering leads a TÜBİTAK 1001-funded project titled "Optimization of the A (High-Speed Activated Sludge) – B (Anammox) Process for Maximum Resource Recovery through Integrated Use of Process Control, Modeling, and Molecular Measurement Tools." The project involves interdisciplinary collaboration with researchers from Marmara University, Istanbul Technical University, and Health Sciences University, aiming to enhance sustainable wastewater treatment technologies.

Discovery of "LTβR Deficiency" Causing Primary Immunodeficiency

Marmara University's Işıl Berat Barlan Translational Medicine Research Center, in collaboration with St. Anna Children's Cancer Research Institute (Vienna) and Can Sucak Translational Immunology Laboratory, identified a new disease, LTβR deficiency, which impairs the development of lymph nodes and tonsils. The findings were published in Science Immunology and have drawn international attention.

LTβR deficiency disrupts lymphoid tissue formation, weakening the immune system and leading to severe infections, particularly in the respiratory system. This research highlights how genetic defects can affect not only immune cells but also the structural organization required for effective immune defense.

Led by Prof. Dr. Safa Barış, in cooperation with Prof. Dr. Kaan Boztuğ and Doç. Dr. Baran Erman, the team also developed therapeutic approaches that controlled infections and improved patient outcomes, providing new insights into primary immunodeficiency treatment.

Marmara University Faculty of Technology faculty member Prof. Dr. Oğuzhan Gündüz was elected as a foreign member of the Romanian Academy of Scientists in the field of chemistry, in recognition of his outstanding contributions and pioneering work in the field.

Prof. Dr. Ahmet Oğuzhan Özen Receives Prestigious **International Award**

Prof. Dr. Ahmet Oğuzhan Özen, from Marmara University's Faculty of Medicine, received the 2024 Eastern Star Award from the European Federation of Immunological Societies (EFIS) for his pioneering research on monogenic inflammatory bowel disease.

His work has advanced disease understanding, contributed to new diagnoses and treatments, and gained international recognition in leading journals such as NEJM, Lancet, and Nature Immunology. The award honors innovative and impactful contributions in immunology.

Prof. Dr. Erdi Ata Bleda's Invention Patented in the U.S.

Marmara University Faculty of Science member Prof. Dr. Erdi Ata Bleda's invention, "Methods and Systems for Interactive Data Management", which introduces an innovative approach at the intersection of physics, computer science, and finance, has been officially patented in the United States.

Prof. Dr. Emrah Çakmakçı Wins First Prize in **International Chemistry Competition**

Marmara University Faculty of Science member Prof. Dr. Emrah Çakmakçı won first prize in Evonik's international competition, "Innovative Applications for POLYVEST® in E-Mobility", aimed at discovering new liquid polybutadiene applications and shaping the future of mobility.









Turkey's Top University in Erasmus+ Funding

Marmara University was once again awarded the highest grant among higher education institutions in Türkiye for the 2024 contract period within the scope of the Erasmus+ KA131 Learning Mobility of Individuals programme, implemented by the European Union and the Turkish National Agency.

Maintaining this achievement since 2015, the university offers hundreds of students, as well as academic and administrative staff, the opportunity to gain education and work experience abroad each year, ranking among the leading institutions in Türkiye in both outgoing and incoming participant numbers.

8 Awards for VR-Based Breast Cancer Early Detection Project

The project "Development of a Breast Cancer Early Diagnosis and Screening Prototype Using Virtual Reality (VR) Technology", led by Assoc. Prof. Nuran Akyurt of Marmara University, won a total of 8 awards in oral and poster presentation categories at the competition organized by the Turkish Medical Radiotechnology Association (TMRT-DER). The ceremony highlighted the project team's innovative contributions to the field of healthcare technologies.

International Awards for MU–UCL VR Education Project

The "Turkey-UK: 3DI 3D Printing & Digital Innovation" project, led by Marmara University in collaboration with University College London (UCL) and supported by the British Council, received the 2024 Royal Society of Chemistry Horizon Prize for Education. Developed by Marmara University's Nanotechnology and Biomaterials Research and Application Center (NBUAM), the project uses innovative virtual reality (VR) software to promote equality and accessibility in education.

It also won Digital Innovation of the Year at the 2024 ACEEU Asia-Pacific Triple E Awards, placed third in the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Community Engagement Initiative category at the Triple E Europe-Africa Forum, and was a finalist in the Technological or Digital Innovation of the Year category at the Times Higher Education Asia Awards 2024. The project's multi-user VR platforms and AI avatars, enabling 24/7 global access to education, have been widely recognized for removing barriers to learning.

Energy Efficiency in Marmara University

The campus has been designed with various features that support the concept of a "GREEN" building. Special attention was given to maximizing energy efficiency through the use of centrally controlled heating and cooling systems, alongside the selection of high-efficiency equipment. To further improve energy conservation, thermal insulation was incorporated into the building structures. Energy-efficient LED bulbs and lighting systems are utilized throughout the campus to minimize electricity consumption while effectively meeting lighting requirements. Architectural planning also prioritized the use of natural daylight to reduce the need for artificial lighting. Additionally, approximately 1.763 kWp of photovoltaic solar panels have been installed on rooftops, enabling the campus to generate a significant portion of its energy needs from renewable solar power.







Zero Waste Initiatives

In March 2019, Marmara University signed a Zero Waste Protocol with the Istanbul Governorship. The protocol has two implementation phases: the first phase involves transitioning the university to zero waste practices, while the second phase requires faculty and students to participate in zero waste training and inspections at national education institutions and public agencies. Marmara University collects waste in accordance with the <u>Waste Management Guide</u> prepared by the Occupational Health and Safety Coordination Unit. Also, Marmara University has met the criteria for the Basic Level Zero Waste Certificate.

Green Energy Certificate

Marmara University Administrative and Financial Affairs Directorate has been awarded the Green Energy Certificate in order to strengthen its support for environmentally friendly energy sources. This certificate shows that some of the energy used at our University is provided by renewable energy sources. This step not only reduces negative impacts on the environment, but also ensures greater commitment to our sustainability values. This transition to green energy demonstrates our commitment to reducing environmental impacts. We have taken another step towards a greener future and we hope to achieve more success with your support in this process.

Solar Energy System

Marmara University Recep Tayyip Erdoğan Complex is situated in the Başıbüyük neighborhood of Istanbul's Maltepe district, covering a total area of 245 hectares. The campus plans to generate energy through approximately 1.763 kWp of photovoltaic solar panels installed on the rooftops of its buildings. By utilizing solar power, a renewable energy source, the campus aims to meet the majority of its own energy demand. Additionally, it adopts an environmentally conscious and resource-friendly approach with the goal of preserving the natural ecosystem and safeguarding local natural resources.

Wind Energy and Virtual Experience Center

The laboratory has been created to offer students hands-on learning opportunities in wind energy technologies. It features a wind turbine prototype that supports a wide range of practical applications, incorporating virtual reality headsets, simulation tools, real-life components, and interactive educational resources to enhance the training experience.

Carbon Footprint


In line with the Sustainable Development Goals, numerous initiatives are being implemented across our campuses with the primary goal of minimizing the carbon footprint. Key objectives include decreasing the number of vehicles within campus areas by promoting eco-friendly transportation alternatives, minimizing waste generation, encouraging recycling practices, avoiding the use of non-biodegradable packaging materials, and repurposing organic waste from plants and animals into compost or fertilizer rather than discarding it.





Student Dormitories

As Marmara University, we attach importance to the accommodation of our students in line with the Sustainable Development Goals. In order to meet the accommodation needs of our university students, 3 Girls' Dormitories in Göztepe Campus, 1 Girls' and 1 Boys' dormitory in Mehmet Genç Complex provide services. Marmara University has been providing service primarily for university members and public employees for many years. In addition, our cafe, which was opened in November 2015, provides service to our members within the campus. The guest house is located in a safe environment within the M.Ü. Göztepe Campus, which is located in Kuyubaşı location on the Kadıköy-Bostancı main line on the Anatolian Side, 10 minutes away from Kadıköy.

Sustainable Transportation

Sustainable Vehicles

Personal vehicle use has been reduced to provide more sustainable transportation for staff. Electric scooters are available for rent around the campus. There are also electric vehicles available for use on campus. This provides both sustainable transportation and a reduction in carbon emissions.

Bicycle-Sharing System

Within the scope of the protocol signed between the Istanbul Provincial Health Directorate of the Ministry of Health and Marmara University for the purpose of "Developing Physical Activity Opportunities", a "Shared Bicycle Area" was created. In the project developed within the scope of this protocol, bicycles were offered to the service of students, faculty members and administrative staff. Bicycles can be purchased with a university ID and a filled form. The bicycles, which can be used on campus after being purchased, will be used both for healthy living and transportation.






















Sustainable Water Use and Infrastructure

Marmara University employs various green campus design strategies with a strong emphasis on water efficiency and environmental sustainability. High-efficiency devices and rainwater-supported irrigation systems are widely used throughout campus landscapes to optimize water consumption.

In alignment with sustainable resource management, significant cleaning and restoration efforts have been carried out in Çobanlar Creek, located within the university grounds. These actions aim to protect existing vegetation, preserve aquatic ecosystems, and improve water quality.

To further enhance irrigation efficiency, the university applies advanced watering methods including drip irrigation, micro-irrigation, sprinkler systems, and surface irrigation—each designed to reduce energy usage while maintaining healthy green spaces.

Rainwater Harvesting Systems

Rainwater collected from building rooftops is directed through pipe systems into filtration units and then stored in underground water tanks. The filtered water is reused for non-potable purposes such as landscape irrigation, supporting the university's water conservation goals.

Groundwater Usage and Emergency Preparedness

In addition to rainwater, groundwater is extracted and stored to support agricultural irrigation and serve as a water source in emergency firefighting situations. This system is supported by electronically controlled water transfer infrastructure, ensuring efficient and reliable water management.

Underwater Cleaning and Marine Awareness Initiatives


Marmara University actively contributes to marine ecosystem conservation through collaborations with national and global environmental initiatives. In partnership with the Underwater Cleaning Movement (STH), a global organization focused on removing waste from seas and oceans, a coordinated underwater cleaning event was organized. Experienced divers from Marmara University dived off Ortaköy Beach and collected marine debris.

This initiative aimed not only to clean the underwater environment but also to raise public awareness about pollution along coastal areas. The collaboration with STH, which brings together diving communities, environmentalists, and marine enthusiasts worldwide, enabled the university to contribute to global efforts in reducing the negative impact of marine litter on underwater ecosystems. As part of the university's commitment to sustainability, Marmara University Environmental Science and Sustainability Student Club (MÜSAS) regularly participates in such events to foster a sense of environmental responsibility among students and the broader community.













Biodiversity and Animal Welfare

Animal Life on Campus

Marmara University continues to implement various initiatives aimed at meeting the nutritional, shelter, and healthcare needs of all living beings residing on its campuses, with a focus on improving animal welfare. The Marmara University Animal Rights Protection Club actively works to ensure that cats and dogs living on campus can lead healthier and longer lives.

Animal species observed on campus include crows, parrots, ducks, rabbits, geese, roosters, chickens, cats, and dogs. Feeding stations have been established across the campus to meet the nutritional needs of stray cats and dogs. Additionally, shelters and nests have been constructed to provide safe living spaces for these animals. University students are also actively involved in feeding and caring for the animals housed in these shelters.

Biodiversity on Campus

Marmara University prioritizes biodiversity conservation and the preservation of traditional agricultural knowledge on its campuses. Within the university's greenhouses, a variety of plant species are cultivated, including magnolia and palm trees, as well as Sardinia, Paşa Kılıcı (Sansevieria), and fern species. In addition, ancestral seed production is carried out for various medicinal and aromatic plants such as rosemary, thyme, and bitter melon, along with ancestral varieties of tomatoes and peppers sourced from the Çorum region.

These initiatives contribute to the preservation of genetic diversity and the promotion of traditional agricultural products. The university supports local seed production efforts by not only cultivating plants but also reproducing and distributing traditional seed varieties.

Waste Oil Project

The "Waste Oil Project", initiated and institutionalized by MÜSAS, emphasizes the importance of recycling used vegetable oils, which account for 25% of marine pollution. The primary goal of the project is to raise awareness about the environmental impact of waste oils and to educate especially children on the importance of environmental protection, with the aim of leaving a cleaner world for future generations.

So far, the project has reached approximately 5,000 children, informing them about the environmental hazards caused by waste oils and the significance of recycling. In addition, around 500 liters of waste oil have been recycled through collaborations with local businesses near the university.

This initiative not only seeks to reduce the harmful effects of waste oils but also aims to foster a broader sense of environmental awareness across society. Through this project, MÜSAS contributes to marine conservation and takes a leading role in waste management efforts within the community.

Green World, Blue Future Project

Carried out annually on June 5th - World Environment Day, the "Green World, Blue Future" project aims to highlight the importance of environmental cleanliness and a sustainable future. In this initiative, held in Düşler Bay, Burgazada, MÜSAS volunteers come together to collect waste along the coastline, cleaning up a total of 70 large bags of garbage from the area. This project goes beyond physical cleanup efforts; it also plays a key role in increasing environmental awareness and advocating for the protection of marine ecosystems. By participating in this event, MÜSAS members emphasize the importance of nature and water, taking collective responsibility for ensuring a cleaner environment for both current and






























Sustainable Food and Zero Hunger ———

Marmara University supports access to healthy, balanced, and affordable food for its students through various initiatives aligned with the UN's Sustainable Development Goal 2: Zero Hunger.

- Free Meal Support: In 2024, the Marmara Lunch Scholarship provided free meals to students in financial need, along with accommodation support for some. Meal scholarships continue to be offered by the Department of Health, Culture, and Sports.
- Cafeteria Services: Lunch and dinner are served at the Göztepe, RTE, and Bağlarbaşı campuses, while lunch is available at others. Approximately 1.5 million meals are served annually. Meals are supplied via a tender process and are regularly inspected and laboratory-tested for quality and safety.
- Sustainable and Inclusive Menu Options: All university cafeterias and cafés offer vegan, vegetarian, and gluten-free options, provided at the same price as standard meals.
- Free Access to Drinking Water: Water dispensers have been installed throughout campuses to ensure students have free and easy access to drinking water.
- **Feedback and Transparency:** Regular satisfaction surveys are conducted, and menus, ingredients, and supplier information are shared publicly on cafeteria boards.

Marmara University Psychological Counseling and Guidance Application and Research Center

Marmara University Psychological Counseling and Guidance Application and Research Center (MARPAM) provides psychological counseling and guidance services to all newly registered and currently enrolled students at associate, undergraduate, and graduate levels, as well as to academic and administrative staff, in line with their needs.

MARPAM aims to support individuals in getting to know themselves, making healthy decisions, developing problem-solving and communication skills, enhancing academic success, adapting to university life, and contributing to their social, emotional, cognitive, and career development.

In addition to this primary goal, the Center also carries out research, implements practices, offers consultancy, and organizes trainings in the field of Psychological Counseling and Guidance both in Turkey and abroad. These efforts are carried out in cooperation with relevant academic units of the university, contributing to both individual well-being and institutional sustainability.


With an inclusive and holistic approach, MARPAM strives to improve psychological well-being, enhance the quality of life within the university community, and provide social impact.

Clean Air in Campus

Our university expects full compliance from academic and administrative staff, as well as students, to support a healthy, clean, and sustainable campus environment.














Accessible Health Services – W









Marmara University is committed to supporting the physical and mental well-being of its students, academic and administrative staff through comprehensive and accessible health services.

Medico-Social Centers located at the Göztepe and Acıbadem Campuses offer primary healthcare services provided by family physicians, general practitioners, and other healthcare professionals. The Göztepe Medico-Social Center includes units such as biochemistry laboratory, X-ray, dental care, treatment and dressing rooms, psychological counseling, and dietary support. Where necessary, patients are referred to external hospitals via university-operated ambulance services.

As part of its inclusive health initiatives, Marmara University is constructing a Disabled Dentistry Application and Research Center within the Recep Tayyip Erdoğan Complex. This center, designed specifically to meet the oral and dental health needs of individuals with disabilities, is expected to be completed by March 2025.

In addition, Marmara University Hospital, located on the Başıbüyük Health Campus, is one of the largest and most advanced university hospitals in the region. Operating with over 650 beds and equipped with state-of-the-art medical technologies, the hospital not only provides high-quality healthcare but also serves as a major center for medical education and research.

These investments and services reflect Marmara University's strong commitment to health, well-being, and inclusive access—core elements of its sustainability vision.











Sports Facilities Supporting Wellbeing →



Marmara University places great importance on supporting the physical, social, and cultural wellbeing of its students and staff. In line with its commitment to creating a healthy and balanced campus life, the university offers a wide range of cultural and sports facilities across its campuses.

At the Göztepe Campus, there are three dedicated cultural centers: the Dr. İbrahim Üzümcü Conference Hall (224-seat capacity), the Institute Building Conference Hall (142-seat capacity), and the 125th Anniversary Amphitheater (open-air, 483-seat capacity). Additionally, the Sultanahmet Campus is home to the Ord. Prof. Dr. Nihat Sayar Conference Hall with a seating capacity of 200. These venues regularly host academic, cultural, and artistic events, contributing to a vibrant campus environment.

In terms of sports infrastructure, the Şehit Ömer Halisdemir Sports Hall at the Göztepe Campus features a basketball and volleyball court with a 643-seat spectator capacity, a fitness room, and a table tennis room. The campus also includes an outdoor astroturf field and an open basketball-volleyball court. At the Mehmet Genç Complex, there is a wellequipped fitness room available for student use.

On weekends, Marmara University organizes free cultural and sports activities, encouraging students to engage in healthy lifestyles. The sports hall at the Göztepe Campus is open to both students and staff for a variety of physical activities throughout the week.

Marmara University is not only committed to providing high-quality sports facilities but also takes pride in the achievements of its students in the field of sports. Many students have represented the university successfully in national and international competitions, further demonstrating the institution's dedication to promoting athletic excellence alongside academic development.

Fire Safety Training at Marmara University

Marmara University's Civil Defense Unit, under the Protection and Security Branch Directorate, organized a fire safety training on June 3–5, 2024, across the Recep Tayyip Erdoğan Campus, Göztepe, and Bağlarbaşı campuses in three separate groups. The training for university staff covered topics such as "What is Fire?", "Building Fire Teams and Their Duties," and "Types of Fire Extinguishing Materials and Equipment." The program included both theoretical and practical sessions and was attended by a total of 189 participants.

Marmara University Search and Rescue Team Participates in Earthquake Drill

Marmara University's Search and Rescue Team (MÜSAR) took part in a February 4, 2025 earthquake drill in Kadıköy, Istanbul, marking the anniversary of the 2023 Kahramanmaraş earthquakes. Coordinated with local authorities and disaster teams, the drill simulated a 7.3-magnitude earthquake and included rubble search, dog-assisted operations, and victim rescues. MÜSAR successfully rescued a mock victim during the exercise. Team members highlighted the drill's value for preparedness, experience, and readiness for future disasters.



Collaborations for Health and Wellbeing →√

Marmara University recognizes the vital importance of collaboration with local, national, and international health institutions to enhance health and well-being outcomes. With its own Faculty of Medicine, the university actively engages in joint studies with various healthcare units, particularly local hospitals. These collaborations often extend to national and international projects that address pressing global health challenges and work toward sustainable solutions.

To this end, Marmara University conducts interdisciplinary research and organizes joint activities in cooperation with its partners. These efforts reflect the university's commitment to promoting healthier and more sustainable lives.

In this context, Marmara University has co-founded the Joint Biotechnology Excellence Application and Research Center (SABIOTEK) in partnership with three other universities. This center aims to support high-impact research and innovation in the field of biotechnology and health sciences.

Thanks to its collaboration with SABIOTEK, Marmara University continues to advance efforts in digital transformation across various health sectors and carries out significant projects in the field of health. Through these activities, the university places strong emphasis on enhancing global health services and takes substantial steps toward this goal.

Inclusive Education and Accessibility for All

Marmara University aims to create an inclusive, equitable, and accessible academic environment by embracing the principle of equal opportunity in education for all students and staff. In this context, the Disabled Student Unit Coordinator plays a key role in advancing accessibility in both physical and digital learning environments. Measures have been taken to facilitate campus mobility for students with visual, auditory, and physical disabilities, while educational materials are provided in accessible formats such as Braille and screen-reader-compatible digital content. Based on student requests, the university provides assistive equipment, assigns part-time student assistants, and makes exam and course arrangements when needed. Even in specialized areas like music education, accessibility is ensured through technologies such as Braille music notation software and screen reader systems. The university's website and library services are also designed to be accessible for all users, offering resources such as Braille printing and thousands of audio books to support diverse learning needs.

Significant physical transformations have been carried out across Marmara University campuses—particularly at Göztepe Campus—to ensure full participation of students with disabilities. New faculty buildings have been constructed based on universal design principles, featuring accessible restrooms, Braille signage, tactile ground surfaces, audio guidance systems, lowered elevator control panels, and non-slip flooring. Faculties of Law, Communication, Business Administration, and Education have all been built or renovated with full accessibility in mind. The RTE Campus buildings, including the Faculties of Engineering and Technology, as well as the Atatürk Faculty of Education, have received accessibility awards within the scope of the Turkish Higher Education Council's "Barrier-Free University" initiative. The campuses also include designated disabled parking areas, ramps, emergency alert systems, and accessible entry platforms. Importantly, Marmara University views accessibility not only as a responsibility toward its students but also as part of its broader social mission. By developing awareness-raising projects and sharing knowledge on disability-related issues, the university aims to contribute to inclusive social transformation while preparing students for a society that values diversity and inclusion.



National Leadership in Accessibility: Marmara University's Success in the 2024 YÖK Awards





As a result of its consistent efforts to foster accessibility and inclusion, Marmara University achieved outstanding success in the 2024 Higher Education Institution Accessible Universities Competition organized by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK). The university received a total of 17 awards, including 6 Flag Awards and 11 Accessible Program Medals, ranking first among Turkish universities that year. To date, Marmara University has received a total of 45 awards in this national initiative. Some of the notable recognitions include the Spatial Accessibility Award granted to the Faculties of Technology, Engineering, and Business Administration; the Accessibility in Education Award received by the Faculties of Engineering and Pharmacy; and the Access in Sociocultural Activities Award awarded to the Faculty of Medicine. Additionally, several undergraduate programs earned Accessible Program Medals thanks to dedicated efforts by their academic staff, including Social Studies Teaching, History Teaching, Classroom Teaching, Public Relations, Cinema-Radio-Television, Nutrition and Dietetics, German Translation and Interpreting, History, Computer Engineering, and Computer Programming. These achievements demonstrate the university's strong commitment to building a barrier-free, equitable learning environment across disciplines.

Accessible Campuses, Equal Futures

Marmara University has implemented its Disabled Student Directive in line with its commitment to providing equal educational opportunities for all students. This directive aims to ensure that students with special needs can fully participate in academic, social, cultural, and accommodation services without barriers. It is aligned with the regulations of the Council of Higher Education (YÖK) and national legislation, and is based on the principles of accessibility, inclusion, and non-discrimination. Within the scope of the directive:

- Educational adjustments are made to meet the individual needs of students with disabilities and facilitate their access to learning materials,
- Exam modifications, course adaptations, and curriculum flexibility are provided when necessary,
- Based on student requests, assistive equipment, part-time student assistants, and learning support services are offered.

In addition, to ensure full participation in all aspects of university life, physical arrangements are made across campuses so that students with disabilities can access not only education but also student clubs, extracurricular activities, and all facilities equally.

This directive is an integral part of Marmara University's broader efforts to raise awareness about disability, promote a barrier-free living culture, and contribute to inclusive social transformation. By empowering individuals with disabilities, the university actively demonstrates its institutional commitment to sustainability.

Planning for the Underrepresented (=)



As a public institution, Marmara University is committed to creating an inclusive and fair environment for all its stakeholders. In this context, comprehensive policies and practices are implemented in areas such as assessing employee needs, business processes, education, career development, performance monitoring, motivation, teamwork, occupational health and safety, and the management of employment and dismissal. These activities are publicly announced through accessible communication channels, such as the university's official website.

The Marmara University Sustainability Office works in close coordination with the Disabled Student Unit and considers accessibility and inclusion as fundamental principles of campus life. The Office places special emphasis on organizing awareness-raising events that support the equal participation and engagement of all individuals on campus. These events aim to highlight the specific challenges faced by underrepresented groups, especially individuals with disabilities, and to promote a culture of empathy, support, and equal opportunity within the university community.

In collaboration with the Disabled Student Unit Coordination, the Sustainability Office also carries out a variety of efforts to support the orientation, promotion, and social integration of students with disabilities into university life. These efforts include accessible campus tours, inclusive orientation activities, and the preparation of informative materials specially designed for students with disabilities. Through these initiatives, Marmara University aims to create a more inclusive, diverse, and supportive learning environment where everyone can participate fully and effectively in both academic and social life.

Gender Equality 🥰

Marmara University recognizes gender equality as a fundamental human right and aims to create an inclusive, equitable, and safe environment in all areas of university life. In this context, the Gender Equality Action Plan for 2022–2026 has been developed and put into practice. The plan outlines concrete goals and strategic actions in areas such as education, research, governance, and campus life to promote gender equality. Within the scope of the plan, a variety of initiatives are being carried out, including ensuring balanced gender representation in academic and administrative staff, mainstreaming gender-sensitive decision-making processes, building an academic culture based on gender awareness, and organizing awareness-raising trainings for students. These activities are monitored through specific performance indicators and regularly reported within a transparent monitoring and evaluation framework.

In 2025, the university took a further institutional step by enacting the Directive on the Commission for Combating Sexual Harassment and Discrimination. The Commission evaluates reports from students and staff in strict confidentiality, prioritizes the statements of the complainant, and gives particular attention to preventing secondary victimization. Composed of at least two female experts in fields such as law, psychology, and human rights, the Commission both investigates incidents and conducts preventive and awareness-raising activities across campus.

Additionally, the Center for Economic and Social Women's Studies (ESKAR), operating within Marmara University, is a significant hub supporting academic production on gender equality. ESKAR conducts interdisciplinary research aimed at strengthening the role of women in economic and social life, produces data to inform public policy, and organizes events to raise public awareness. Through applied initiatives such as the Women's Cooperatives Training Project, the center supports women's entrepreneurship and enhances their skills in production, digital marketing, and governance.

Together for Gender Equality: Awareness and Solidarity Gathering on March 8

The Human Rights and Constitutional Law Research Club of Marmara University, in collaboration with Bahçeşehir University, organized a two-day event for International Women's Day. The program addressed challenges women face in professional life, mansplaining, discrimination in disaster areas, and issues affecting migrant women and queer individuals, aiming to raise awareness on gender equality.

Workshop on "Participation and Employment of Women with Disabilities in Social Life"

On March 28, 2024, the third session of the "Participation and Employment of Women with Disabilities" workshop was held at Göztepe Campus in cooperation with the Disabled Student Unit Coordination Office and ESKAR. The session focused on improving regulations and developing inclusive social policies with input from public institutions and Marmara University faculty.

Award-Winning Achievement in Breast Cancer Awareness with Virtual Reality

The project titled "Development of a Virtual Reality (VR) Prototype for Early Diagnosis and Screening of Breast Cancer", led by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nuran Akyurt from Marmara University, achieved significant success in the competition organized by the Turkish Society of Medical Radiotechnology (TMRT-DER) between March 12 and April 30, 2024. The project was awarded a total of 8 prizes in the oral and poster presentation categories.

Breast Health Education with VR on March 8

As part of International Women's Day activities, Marmara University Vocational School of Health Services organized a breast health and self-examination (BSE) training for teachers, students, and parents at Kartal Sabiha Gökçen Vocational and Technical Anatolian High School under the slogan "Be aware, be hopeful about breast health."

Breast Health Awareness Event for Health Sciences Students

In collaboration with Marmara University, Istanbul Medeniyet University, the Breast Health Association (Memeder), and the Turkish Nurses Association, an event titled "Breast Health, BSE, and Early Diagnosis" was organized for health sciences students.

Held on October 31 at Istanbul Medeniyet University's Cevizli Campus, the event was part of the project "Development of a Virtual Reality (VR) Prototype for Early Diagnosis and Screening of Breast Cancer" led by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nuran Akyurt.

The event emphasized the importance of early diagnosis in breast cancer through BSE workshops and virtual reality applications.

International Journal

Marmara University carries out academic studies as a result of the importance it attaches to gender equality and women's rights. In this context, Marmara University has published a journal under the name of Journal of Women and Gender Studies to expand academic studies.



It is an international peer-reviewed electronic journal published twice a year. The magazine includes articles written in every field on women and gender issues. It aims to encourage academic studies in the field of women and gender, and to contribute to the development of an academic discussion environment that will reveal women's problems and their causes and enable the development of solutions in order to raise the economic and social status of women in society.



Sports Achievements













Marmara University promotes sports for students' physical and social development, supporting teams across disciplines. Our athletes achieve national and international success, representing the university and Türkiye. Backed by the Faculty of Sport Sciences, training is scientifically guided, while collaborations with clubs and institutions help students develop teamwork, leadership, and active citizenship.

Success in Turkish University Swimming Championship

At the Turkish University Swimming Championship held at Middle East Technical University in Ankara between May 6–8, 2024, Marmara University's Men's Swimming Team placed 3rd overall. Our student-athletes also achieved outstanding individual success, winning a total of 18 medals. Notable results include: 2nd place in the 4 × 100 m Freestyle Relay – Men, 1st and 2nd place finishes in the 200 m Freestyle – Women by Ecem Kemer and Nida Eliz Üstündağ respectively, 1st place in the 4 × 50 m Mixed Freestyle Relay, 1st place in the 100 m Butterfly – Women, and 1st place in the 400 m Freestyle – Women.

Team and Individual Achievements in Indoor Athletics

At the Turkish Interuniversity Indoor Athletics Championship held in Bursa on March 6–7, 2024, Marmara University placed 2nd in the men's and 3rd in the women's team rankings. Our student-athletes also achieved outstanding individual results, earning numerous medals across various disciplines. Notable highlights include: Berra Aygün's 1st place in women's high jump, Abdulhalik Çağıran's 1st place in the men's 3000m, and multiple 2nd and 3rd place finishes by athletes such as Elif Aydın, Esmanur Yılmaz, Volkan Erdoğan, Ayetullah Baz, Sevde Ecenur Türkay, Osman Mercimek, and others. In addition, our mixed, men's, and women's relay teams achieved 2nd and 3rd places in their respective categories.

International Achievement in Rhythmic **Gymnastics Judging**

Prof. Dr. Ani Agopyan, a faculty member of the Department of Coaching Education, represented Türkiye at the 15th Intercontinental Rhythmic Gymnastics Judges' Course held in Lausanne, Switzerland, from November 29 to December 2, 2024. She demonstrated outstanding performance in all individual and group exams, becoming the first person in our history to earn the prestigious title of "Category 1 International Rhythmic Gymnastics Group Judge", marking a significant milestone in both national and institutional representation.

Marmara University Sailing Club Wins Third Place at Cumhuriyet Cup

Marmara University Sailing Club (MUSAILING) secured third place in the 5th Presidential International Yacht Races - Cumhuriyet Cup, supported by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism, Ministry of Youth and Sports, Istanbul Governorship, and Turkish Sailing Federation. Competing against 86 teams from 14 countries, MUSAILING's Vice President Ali Yelten led the team to a podium finish in the B Division.

Karate Team Wins Turkish University Championship

Marmara University Karate Team became the overall champion at the Turkish University Karate Championship. The Men's Kumite Team was crowned champion, while Mert Halici (-60 kg) and Aysima Karakaya (-61 kg) secured individual championship titles in their respective weight classes. Nisa Sazak (-50 kg) and Eren Adil Yılmazer (-75 kg) placed second, and the Women's Kumite Team finished third overall. Additionally, Serra Nur Çevikdal (-55 kg) and Mustafa Aydemir (-84 kg) earned third place in their categories.

International Success from Our Korfball Team

Between September 27-29, 2024, Marmara University Sports Club's Korfball Team secured third place in the IKF Champions League First Round held in Lisbon, Portugal. With this achievement, the team qualified to participate in the IKF Satellite Final Tournament to be held in January 2025.



















Integrating Sports into Campus Life: MarmaraRun and MarmaraCup

MarmaraCup'24 Highlights the Unifying Power of Sports

Organized by the Marmara University Alumni Office Coordination Unit, the "6th International MarmaRun: Running by the Bosphorus" took place on May 26, 2024, with the participation of university members, students, and sports enthusiasts. Over 1,000 runners took part in the 5K and 10K courses, which started at the Küçüksu Pavilion in Anadoluhisarı and looped back from Çubuklu Pier. Notably, 600 of the participants were university students, emphasizing youth involvement in physical activity. The event brought together three generations on the same track, symbolizing intergenerational solidarity through sports. In addition to the race, side activities such as foot tennis, darts, badminton, bowling, and golf were organized to promote active lifestyles. Held in collaboration with Beykoz Municipality, the Provincial Directorate of Youth and Sports, the Provincial Health Directorate, and the Federation for Sport for All (HiS), the event reflects Marmara University's commitment to promoting public health and social cohesion.

6th MarmaRun: Running by the Bosphorus

The traditional "MarmaraCup'24" Rector's Cup Tournament, organized by the Department of Health, Culture, and Sports at Marmara University, was held throughout the 2023–2024 academic year at the Şehit Ömer Halisdemir Sports Hall in the Göztepe Campus. 
